QUICK FACTS

- The unemployment rate is down 8.7% dropping to 4.2% month-overmonth, and total employment rose by 210,000.
- While fewer jobs were added than expected, we have also seen upward revisions over the last several months indicating that the lower-thananticipated jobs numbers may not tell the whole story.
- This employment survey also taken before omicron variant popped up.
- Wages still increasing, quits rate still at near-record highs.
- The economy has added a total of 18.5 million jobs since April 2020 but is still 3.9 million jobs lower than pre-pandemic levels.
- Long-term unemployment remains stable at 2.2 million.
- Labor force participation increased slightly by 0.32% month over month to 61.8%.
- Wages increased 4.8% year over year, increased 0.3% month over month to \$31.03 an hour.
- Notable industry gains: Professional and business services, 90,000 jobs added; transportation and warehousing, 50,000; manufacturing, 31,000.
